BISHOP'S CORNER



Dear Fellow-Catholics,

Two weeks ago the British parliament became acquainted with the specially prepared report on sexual harassment. It then called upon the UK government to address this issue of sexual harassment of women by restricting access to sexually explicit media, especially pornography. The damage caused by this is compared to that caused by cigarettes.

Sexual harassment is connected to the way women are portrayed in pornography and other areas of the mainstream media - we learn from the report. It also cites research that states that women are often put in awkward situations because of the eroticization of images presented in the media which also contribute to the trivialization of violence against women.

The report mentions a survey according to which 85 percent of women between 18 and 24 years old and 65% of all women have experienced public sexual harassment. 35 percent admitted that they were touched against their will. Members of parliament clearly underline the harmful effect of pornography on society, pointing out that it is perceived by many as an acceptable and normal source of "sexual education". Parliament states that the government is inconsistent in its approach to this problem. An example is in the terms of age verification policy that would defend minors against the harmful influence of pornography. Limitations in porno magazine sales also leave much to be desired. It is also called to develop research on the correlation between the so-called "Adult movies" and sexual harassment.

As a saying says, "An ounce of prevention is worth a pound of cure".
