

Pastoral Reflection

God's Graciousness

The multiplication of loaves in the First Reading was chosen to parallel the Gospel. These readings demonstrate the graciousness of GOD. Not only is a small amount of bread and fish able to completely satisfy the hunger of a hundred people, but then there are leftovers. GOD's graciousness is truly more magnanimous than anyone could expect. We also see this graciousness in the story of Jesus feeding the 5,000 men in number.

First, Abundance in Scarcity: Jesus performing a miracle by feeding a multitude with just five loaves and two fish. It teaches us that even in times of scarcity or when faced with seemingly insurmountable challenges, Jesus can provide an abundance beyond our expectations. It reminds us to trust God's graciousness and not to be discouraged by our limited human capability.

Second, Sharing and Generosity: A young boy in the story generously offers his meager provisions to Jesus, which in turn leads to a miraculous multiplication of food. This highlights the importance of sharing what we have, no matter how small or insignificant it may seem. But it encourages us to be generous with our resources, knowing that God can work wonders with even the simplest act of kindness and generosity.

Third, Nourishment for Body and Soul: Jesus not only provides physical sustenance to the crowd, but also offers them spiritual nourishment though his teachings and presence. This miracle underscores the idea that Jesus is the Bread of Life who satisfies our deepest hunger and thirst. It reminds us that true fulfillment comes from a relationship with Christ, who is gracious and provides for all our needs, both material and spiritual.

GOD is truly gracious. HE abundantly pours out blessings on all those who seek divine help. Through HIS generosity, Christ continues to work miracles in our midst. Finally, HE nourishes the holy people who come together at the table of the Lord Jesus.

Contacting Fr. Vivien


As a reminder, Fr. Vivien now has his own telephone extension in his room at St. Theresa's Rectory. This will be the best way to contact him going forward.

The Bishop's Corner - The Vatican Cricket Team

Dear Fellow-Catholics.

When I read this news, I thought that it perfectly fits the coming week in Bermuda.

The Vatican cricket team went to London for its tour to take on the England over 60s, St. Mary's University, and in a highly anticipated match at Windsor Castle, the King Charles' squad. This was the tenth 'Light of Faith' tour of the Vatican cricket team since its formation in 2014. Previous destinations have included Portugal, Italy, Argentina, Kenya, Malta, Spain, and the UK. The aim of this year's trip was, as always, to promote dialogue and friendship between the Catholic Church and the host country. A post on the team's social media page spoke of "spreading the message of friendship, unity, and gospel hope."

The emphasis was also on the fact that the players, who are all seminarians and priests based in Rome (this time all from India), were 'ambassadors' for Catholic priesthood. As the team's director, Fr. Eamonn O'Higgins, reminded the team at a meeting in Rome prior to departure, they may well be the only Catholic priests that many of those they interact with will ever meet.

The Vatican squad, officially St. Peter's Cricket Team, is part of Athletica Vaticana, an umbrella organisation bringing together all the Vatican's athletes. Earlier this year, Pope Francis thanked Athletica Vaticana for its commitment to "promoting fraternity, inclusion and solidarity", and for "bearing witness to the Christian faith among sportswomen and men". The Pope said, "In the particularly dark historical moment we are living, sport can build bridges, break down barriers, and foster peaceful relations."
